

Implementation Points of Emergency Relief Fund for Students of National Yunlin University of Science and Technology

Resolution of the executive council on Nov. 5, 1996

Passed by the 5th executive meeting in 2001

Adopted and implemented at the 7th executive meeting on April 7, 2009

Adopted and implemented at the 9th executive meeting on May 29, 2012

1. Purpose: In order to help students in this school who are in need and whose families are poor to receive assistance in the shortest possible time so that they can study with peace of mind, these key points are formulated.
2. Application qualifications:

All students of our school who come from poor families and encounter the following situations may apply:

 - (1) Those who suffer from accidental casualties or serious illnesses and cannot afford medical expenses.
 - (2) Those whose families have suffered sudden major changes.
 - (3) Others who are in urgent need of assistance.
3. Acceptance Procedure:
 - (1) The student, parent, tutor or other teacher who meets the application qualifications shall fill in the application form (such as the attached form) within 6 months from the date of occurrence, and attach the original latest 3 months' whole household registration transcript, the front and the back photocopy of the student ID card, proof of poverty certificate or (middle) low-income household, other relevant factual supporting documents and all these will be submitted to the Life Counseling Group of the Office of Student Affairs after informing the director of the department and the student's tutor.
 - (2) The Academic Affairs Office will issue the amount based on the facts and the professional suggestions. After completing the written review, it will consult with the Counseling Center and the Accounting Office, and forward it to the principal for approval before issuing it, or transfer it to the National Yunlin University of Science and Technology Culture and Education Fund to apply for the issuance.
4. Conditions and amount of relief funds to issue:
 - (1) If a student is hospitalized for more than 7 days due to injury or illness, NT\$10,000 will be issued; if a student meets the National Health Insurance standards for major injuries or illnesses or if an accidental death occurs,

NT\$20,000 will be issued.

- (2) Students who have been abused, abandoned, or forced to engage in improper professional conduct by their parents or guardians, resulting in the inability to live in the family, or the government approved Social Welfare Institute has entrusted the relatives to take care of the students (social welfare documents must be attached), NT\$15,000 will be issued.
- (3) Students whose parents or guardians have one of the following circumstances have put their family in financial difficulties and are unable to provide for them:
 1. If one party has been missing for more than 6 months, or has been serving a sentence in prison, or has involuntarily resigned, NT\$10,000 will be issued.
 2. If one party meets the National Health Insurance standards for major injuries and illnesses, NT\$18,000 will be issued.
 3. If one party dies, NT\$20,000 will be issued. If both parties die within 6 months, the maximum total payment will be NT\$60,000.
- (4) If a student's family is hit by a natural disaster, causing life to be in trouble and seriously affecting schooling, the amount will be issued as follows (Note: Overseas Chinese students will need certification documents recognized by overseas units):
 1. For those who suffer serious financial losses (with documents certified by the fire department, police or township or district office), NT\$5,000 will be issued.
 2. For those whose houses are half-destroyed (fallen down) (with documents certified by the township or district office), NT\$10,000 will be issued.
 3. If the house is completely destroyed (fallen down) (with certificate from the township or district office), NT\$20,000 will be issued.
 4. Those whose private land has been lost (with documents certified by the township or district office) will be issued NT\$10,000.
- (5) For students due to other reasons such as special family circumstances, poverty, or major accidents, the tutor, department director or instructor will recommend the amount to be approved and then apply according to the third point.
5. For the same event, the application is limited to one time for a family unit.
6. Funding sources: public funds and scholarships from the school's students and donations from school community organizations, enterprises or well-wishers.
7. This key point is approved by the Executive Council and implemented after approval by the principal. The same applies to revisions.
